- Luna is a 20 kg Standard Poodle that begins to retch, salivate and pant after intense exercise. Initially she was very anxious but soon becomes lethargic.
- You decide to do an abdominal radiograph.

- Rex is a 4 year old Springer Spaniel that has become anorexic and lethargic. During the last few days he vomits occasionally.
- You do serum chemistry and discover his liver enzymes are increased.
- The abdominal radiographs are normal
- What should you do next?

- Sarah is a 2 year old DSH cat who is anorexic, vomited 4 times this morning, and is 8 % dehydrated.
- You decide to an abdominal x-ray.

- Rafter is a 5 year old male Border Terrier who vomited 5 times this morning and is completely anorexic.
- You decide to do an abdominal x-ray.

- Felix is a 4 year old DSH cat who started to salivate this morning. You look down her throat but can't see anything abnormal.
- You decide to do a radiograph of the larynx and trachea including the thorax.

- Spike is a 7 year old DSH cat that has become completely anorexic for the last 3 days. The abdomen seems to be slightly enlarged.
- You decide to do an abdominal radiograph

- Champ is a 1 year old German Shepard who started regurgitating his food over the last few days. He drinks water normally but regurgitates his solid food.
- You decide to do a Thoracic radiograph

- Brutus is a 8 year old Great Dane who became acutely lethargic this morning. He is completely anorexic. The owner also said he vomited 4 times this morning.
- He shows pain when his abdomen is palpated.
- You decide to do an abdominal radiograph.

Mesenteric Torsion



- Ruby is a 4 month old black labrador who didn't eat this morning, had bloody diarrhea and was quite lethargic.
- You palpate a mass in the posterior abdomen
- You decide to do an abdominal radiograph.

Flicka is a 5 year old Pekinese that vomited 2 times this morning. The owner thought she ate something in the backyard.

• You decide to do an abdominal x-ray.
